#### **VILLAGE BOARD MEETING UPDATES**

The contractor for the Spring Sewer Project was selected at a Special Meeting in December. Thanks to a Grant from the State, BCA Engineering will be beginning the project in the Spring. January's meeting will be January 29th. The meetings are held at the Village office, 4059 Cherry Street at 6:00 pm.



### Water Study for Setting up districts

The Village had contracted with an engineering firm to understand the logistics of setting up a Water District for those water. This includes those in the Town of Turin and the Town of Lyonsdale. According oming shortly. to Law, we should've always had water districts but instead relied on their quarterly payments in good faith.

Due to needing to provide security in case of catastrophic failure and to the need to be able to levy unpaid bills on their land taxes, districts will now need to be established. The first step is to have a study completed. Costs for them entire process will be covered by grant and help from the Lewis County.
