SUMMARY FROM NEW AND IMPROVED FESTIVAL COMMITTEE

We have a new Facebook page, Lyons Falls Festival. We also have a new website, www.lyonsfallsfestival.com.

We are changing a few things. Parking will be at Otis Technology for everybody and there will be a shuttle that holds 25 people that will run throughout the Festival hours continually. No parking in the park or driving thru at any time.

We are organizing a gun raffle, with limited tickets, expensive guns and sales will begin March 1, 2026 and the winners will be announced before the fireworks on the 4th. Otis will also be donating gun kits for each specific gun raffle. All guns will be on the website as soon as we decide what to buy, and we are not allowed to post them on Facebook so all people should be directed to both the website and the Facebook page for updates.

Due to scheduling conflicts for the 250 year birthday of the nation, fireworks will be on July 5th, at 10 pm.

We are having a Beer, Wine and liquor truck, The problem we have is all vendors or food trucks want an approximate attendance and it will be very low due to a Sunday and everybody is celebrating somewhere else.

The Festival hours are going to be changed to 4:00 to 10:00, ending with the fireworks which is an 18 minute show. We will have music coinciding with the fireworks. Still trying to find a band to play at all.

Tentative ideas:

We will have a petting zoo and a reptile zoo with great animals, including llamas and maybe even a kangaroo that will be 3 hours starting at 4:00 They are highly used by everybody around the state because of the animals featured . There will also Karaoke for the kids. We will have live radio broadcast for 4 hours starting at 4:00 and music will be played all the time he is live. It is the Moose. We are working with a company out of Syracuse that provides picture booths, obstacle courses, bouncy house, etc. We are looking at all events to see what would be the best. We are trying to secure a hot air balloon, but they can only tether from 6:30 to 8:30 because of temps, hoping for medical helicopter, medical tent that takes blood pressure and gives health tips, and an ambulance and fire truck for the entire festival.

The BBQ will be from 4 to 6 and then we will have burgers, hot dogs etc until 9 served by the firemen. There will be no food trucks. Only a truck that serves ice cream and such.

No car show.

No parade. The parade would have to be to early and nothing is scheduled in the park until 4. The firetrucks will just stage at the park for people to view and hopefully allow the kids to climb aboard.

So, if all goes well, we will have the national anthem sung at 9:30, announce the raffle winners, present a color guard and gun salute from Fort Drum, and then the fireworks.

The day should end by 10:30.

We are looking for volunteers for bathroom attendant, set up and break down, gate attendant to stop park entry and direct people to Otis for parking




LYONESSE HAS MADE HER NARRATIVE DEBUT!
